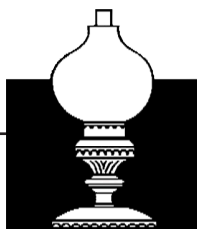

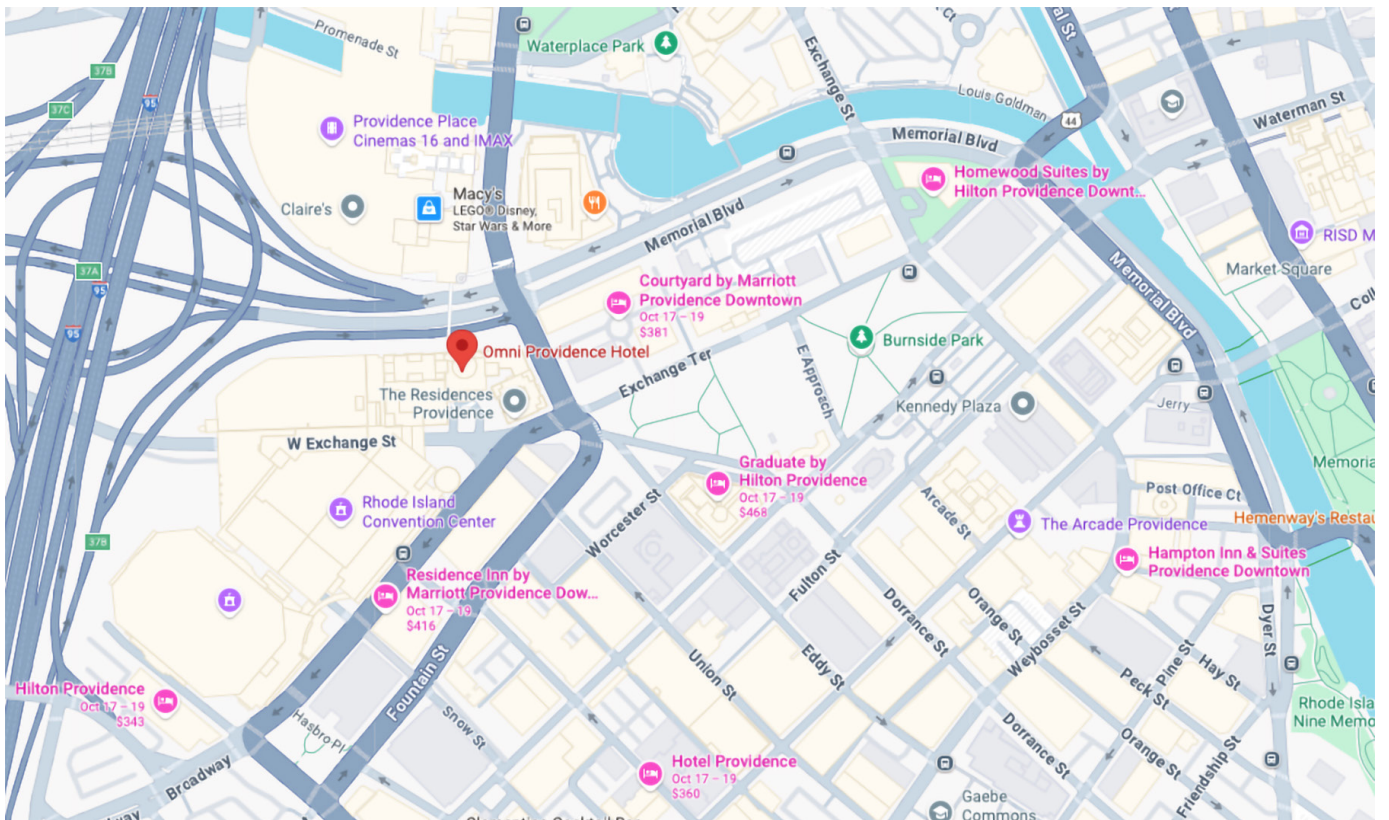
NEARBY
