We are delighted to invite you to the Spring 2024 session of the Priory Scholars. Class will be held on **Saturday, May 4, 12pm-4pm EDT**. Leave your Alpine-stocks and cigarette cases behind, and meet at THE CHURCHILL TAVERN, 45 East 28th Street, New York, NY 10016, located between Madison and Park Avenues, around the corner from the 28th Street subway station for the 4 & 6 trains.

Our meeting will be centered around **"The Final Problem,"** which could be one of the mostoften-studied canonical stories. When you prepare for our meeting, I would ask you to consider this story in two contradictory ways:

- 1) **This is the final story**. These events happen as described, and the Holmes/Watson partnership ends at the Reichenbach Falls.
- 2) **This is** <u>not</u> the final story. These events happen as described, and Sherlock Holmes returns to London a few years later in "The Empty House."

I think it will be interesting to discuss the story under both approaches; and please note that both involve taking Watson at his word as to the events of the tale. In addition to this discussion, we will be challenged by another of Prof. Raj Pandravada's binomial quizzes, which has had a European vogue. Other possible topics of discussion include:

- **"the genius and the wonder of the thing"** How does Watson make Moriarty dangerous and thrilling? Especially considering this is the character's introduction.
- **"a charming week"** Consider Watson's use of place and atmosphere in this story. Is this adventure more a travelogue than a mystery?
- **"your memoirs will draw to an end"** –What observations come to mind when this story is considered in light of the fact that it was envisioned as a series conclusion?
